- Number of marine mammals
- Age classification of marine mammal
- Behavior of marine mammal

Data Collection

Some types of projects you may work on are:

- Marine construction (dock, port)
- Oil, gas, and seismic (exploration and permit compliance)

As a PSO, you will collect following data:

- Weather
- Mammal identification
- Estimated number of mammals
- Age class of mammal
- Animal behavior (traveling, milling, diving, looking, sinking, etc.)
- Closest point of approach of mammal from you and the project site

As a PSO, you are expected to

- Work 8–12-hour days outside during cold/inclement weather
- Work on a team and report to a lead PSO
- Communicate conditions quickly and accurately
